5. Parental Involvement Policy

Statement of intent

Welford Pre-school recognises that parents/carers are the primary educators of their children and greatly respect the unique knowledge that parents/carers have of their child. We believe that children benefit most from early years' education and care when parents/carers and Welford Pre-school work together in partnership.

Aim

- Our aim is to support parents/carers as their children's first and most important educators by involving them in their children's education and in the full life of the setting.
- Some parents/carers are less well represented in early years settings; these include fathers, parents who live apart from their children but who still play a part in their lives, as well as working parents. In carrying out the following procedures, we will ensure all parents/carers are included.
- When we refer to 'parents/carers' we mean both mothers and fathers; these include both natural or birth parents as well as step-parents and parents who do not live with their children, but have contact with them and play a part in their lives. 'Parents/carers' also includes same sex parents as well as foster parents.
- 'Parental responsibility' is all the rights, duties, powers and responsibilities and authority, which by law a parent/carer of a child has in relation to the child and their property.

Methods

In order to fulfil these aims we:

- are committed to on-going dialogue with parents/carers to improve our knowledge of the needs of their children and to support their families;
- provide a key person to work with each child and their family, and support the needs of the child and parents/carers;
- inform all parents/carers about how Welford Pre-school is run and its policies through access to written information and through regular informal communication;
- encourage and support parents/carers to play an active part in the governance and management of Welford Pre-school via committee membership;
- can inform all parents/carers on a regular basis about their children's progress as required both verbally and through information uploaded on Tapestry;
- involve parents/carers in the shared record keeping about their children both formally and informally and ensure parents/carers have access to their children's developmental progress records via Tapestry;

- welcome the contributions of parents/carers, in whatever form these may take;
- provide opportunities for parents/carers to contribute their own skills, knowledge and interests to all activities of Welford Pre-school;
- consult with parents/carers about the times of meetings to avoid excluding anyone and in order to hold meetings in venues that are accessible and appropriate for all;
- inform all parents/carers of the systems for registering queries, complaints or suggestions and check to ensure these are understood. All parents/carers have access to our written complaints procedure;
- provide opportunities for parents/carers to learn about the curriculum offered in Welford Pre-school with support given to promote learning at home where required;
- have a means to ensure all parents/carers are included that may mean
 we have different strategies for involving fathers or parents who work or
 live apart from their children;
- consult with all parents/carers to find out what works best for them;
- ensure on-going dialogue with parents/carers to improve our knowledge of the needs of their children and to support their families;
- provide information about opportunities to be involved in the setting in ways that are accessible to parents/carers with basic skills needs, or those for whom English is an additional language.
